CROWNED AND DANGEROUS by Rhys Bowen (M)

Royal Spyness #10. Throwing cares to the wind, Lady Georgiana Rannoch and Darcy O'Mara set out to elope...until Darcy's father is arrested for murdering a rich American...and now it's up to them to prove he's innocent.

THE SECRET CHORD by Geraldine Brooks (F)

Lennox Kemp #6. Kemp joins his lover, Penelope Marsden, at a luxury resort on the Cornish coast where he chances to meet Mirable Snape, the wife of a client. When a man's decapitated head turns up in a fisherman's net, Mirable, for reasons unknown, becomes catatonic, and Kemp finds himself investigating a murder case perhaps linked to her flashy crowd.
